## Word Worms

This is a special Between the Lions game for two players. It goes like this. Print all four sheets and cut out all of the pieces. Don't cut along the dotted lines! Fold each piece in half, along the dotted line, so that there is one word on each side. Divide the pieces equally between the two of you. You don't have to use all the pieces, but the more you use, the longer the game will last. Experiment to find a number both of you are comfortable with.

Sit at opposite sides of a table, or on the floor. The younger person puts one word in the middle, with one word facing each player.

The other player then places a piece whose first letter matches the last letter of that word, or whose last letter matches the first letter of that word. Once there is more than one piece on the table, players continue back and forth, always adding a word to either end of the Word Worm. Miss a turn if you can't go.

When neither of you can go any more, you'll both see a pretty long Word Worm winding across the table.

## Word Worms (continued)

The side facing you might say **Hamster--Right--Tree--Eagle** (see the way the start and end letters match up?). With the same pieces, the other player might see **Envelope--Eat--Tower--Rich**. Both of you must now make up a story using all of your words in the order they come. Read from left to right. If the words are too hard, help your kid read the words.

Here are two examples:

Harry **Hamster** was heading **Right** home when, from the **Tree** above him, an **Eagle** swooped and stole his hat...

Tasha opened the gold **Envelope** to find an invitation to **Eat** dinner in Toffee **Tower** with the **Rich** woman who lived there...

This domino game promotes letter awareness, and, for more advanced readers, it's a great story-starter game.
